Promote Downtown Redevelopment Opportunities

The purpose of the property redevelopment primer is to explore housing and economic opportunities in downtown Evart. Properties within the downtown that have underutilized space may be eligible for redevelopment to become unique residential or retail opportunities. The Michigan Main Street program and Evart Main Street worked with Revitalize LLC to assist property owners and prospective developers to explore these redevelopment opportunities and identify potential financial assistance for projects.


