Downtown business, Soo Co-op Credit Union, organized the first annual "Soo Co-op Credit Union Downtown Cleanup Day" on June 19, where other community volunteers joined. This was the first of many going forward to ensure our downtown stays vibrant and beautiful.



Prim Aesthetics was the recipient of MEDC's Match on Main grant this year, which provided them the opportunity to purchase a new hydrafacial machine. The machine created a new service for Prim that was the first of its kind to the area.



A new event, titled "Friday Nights at Dusk," was created over the summer in partnership with Nicolet Bank and Lake Superior State University.
