TRANSFORMING GRAND HAVEN'S DOWNTOWN



The year of 2022 was Grand Haven Main Street's first year operating a social district in a portion of our Main Street District. This successful activity will continue to drive visitor's and residents of the area into our district to experience all we have to offer!



Peerless Flats has completed their construction project, turning two blocks of downtown property, vacant for over 40 years, into a beautiful and vibrant 133 apartment-unit development. Developments like these have a year-round impact to our district by adding year-round residents in each unit!



Grand Haven Main Street was lucky enough to expand the outdoor dining once again in 2022, and it was in no small part due to an MEDC vibrancy grant. This helped pave the way to close a full block to traffic for the summer, add additional public gathering spaces open to all, and create a fun zone with corn hole games, sidewalk chalk, and activities for the whole family to enjoy.
