

Michigan State Historic Preservation Office Certified Local Government Program FY22 CLG Grant Funding Priorities

The Michigan State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has established the following funding priorities for the FY22 Certified Local Government (CLG) grant cycle. Projects that address one or more of the funding priorities will receive extra points during the selection process. See the CLG grant manuals at www.michigan.gov/CLGgrants for additional information on the scoring criteria.

Funding priorities are presented in no certain order.

- 1. Community preservation plans to guide local government preservation activities.
- 2. Documentation, evaluation, and local designation/National Register nomination of:
 - a. Resources associated with underrepresented, minority, or disadvantaged populations;
 - b. Resources in CLGs underrepresented in the CLG grant program
- 3. Design guidelines for local historic districts and updates to existing guidelines
- 4. Rehabilitation planning (e.g., feasibility studies, plans and specifications, Historic Structure Reports (HSRs), Cultural Landscape Reports (CLRs), etc.) and rehabilitation projects that promote investment in underutilized and/or threatened National Register properties
- 5. Implementation of digital initiatives (e.g., archaeological studies, survey methodologies, phone or web applications, etc.) that can serve as models for other CLGs
