Dear Certified Local Government:

The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) is now accepting fiscal year (FY) 2022 Certified Local Government (CLG) grant applications. Funds are available for documentation, education, and community-based preservation planning projects, as well as rehabilitation planning and rehabilitation activities.

**Grant Eligibility:** Only CLGs that have been certified prior to the grant application deadline may apply for grant funding. CLGs may sponsor projects for certified non-profit organizations and public entities within their jurisdictions, so long as the project meets CLG grant program eligibility. **Match Requirements:** There is no match requirement for FY22 CLG grant projects.
