- Ambitious | setting goals and targets toward real, progressive action
- Inclusive | involves partnerships with governments, other communities, and other stakeholders from planning through implementation
- Fair | shares responsibility and benefits equally across the municipality
- Comprehensive &
   Integrated | both sectoral and cross-sectoral, involving regional initiatives and varying degrees of governance
- Relevant | supports local efforts and focuses on solving challenges that residents are facing
- Actionable | cost effective and realistically implementable
- Evidence-based | utilizes scientific data as well as qualitative community input to inform decision-making

The Local Governments for Sustainability, or ICLEI (formerly the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives) is a network of professionals focused on sustainable urban development and systemic change related to climate action. These professionals work across many different sectors, branches of government, and within non-governmental organizations.
