Please take notice that the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) will hold four public hearings to solicit public comments on MEDC's plan for the allocation and expenditure of \$71,931,000 in CDBG-DR funds, which the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development allocated to Michigan pursuant to the Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2022. Michigan received \$59,898,000 for 2020 (FR-6303) and \$12,033,000 for 2021 (FR-6326).
